## RESOLUTION

(T.D.G. Corp. d/b/a Sirness Vending Services Project)

A regular meeting of the County of Monroe Industrial Development Agency d/b/a Imagine Monroe Powered By COMIDA (the "Agency"), was held at the Parma Town Hall, 1300 Hilton Parma Road, Hilton, New York 14468, on November 21, 2017.

After the meeting had been duly called to order, the Chair announced that among the purposes of the meeting was to consider and take action on certain matters pertaining to a certain Project more particularly described below.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY OF MONROE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY D/B/A IMAGINE MONROE POWERED BY COMIDA TAKING OFFICIAL ACTION APPOINTING T.D.G. CORP. D/B/A SIRNESS VENDING SERVICES AS AGENT OF THE AGENCY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ACQUIRING CERTAIN VEHICLES FOR USE IN ITS MICRO-MARKET FOOD SERVICE OPERATION, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN AGENT AGREEMENT AND THE EXECUTION OF RELATED DOCUMENTS.

WHEREAS, by Title I of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as amended and Chapter 55 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York (collectively, the "Act"), the Agency was created with the authority and power among other things, to assist with the acquisition of certain industrial development projects as authorized by the Act; and

WHEREAS, T.D.G. CORP. D/B/A SIRNESS VENDING SERVICES, a New York corporation, for itself or an entity formed or to be formed (the "Company"), submitted an application, attached hereto as Exhibit A, to the County of Monroe Industrial Development Agency d/b/a Imagine Monroe Powered By COMIDA (the "Agency") requesting the Agency to assist with a certain project (the "Project") consisting of the acquisition of fourteen (14) 2017 Dodge Promaster 3500 refrigeration vans and one (1) 2017 Dodge Promaster City Service van (collectively, the "Equipment") for use in the Company's business as a vending and micro-market food service operator; which Equipment is to be maintained at the Company's offices located at 3595 Buffalo Road in the Town of Gates, New York 14624; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes and empowers the Agency to promote, develop, encourage and assist projects such as the Project and to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that the Agency will (i) negotiate an agent agreement (the "Agent Agreement"), pursuant to which the Agency will appoint the Company as its agent for the purpose of acquiring the Equipment and (ii) provide financial assistance (the "Financial Assistance") to the Company in the form of a sales and use tax exemption for purchases and rentals related to the acquisition the Equipment.

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County of Monroe Industrial Development Agency d/b/a Imagine Monroe Powered By COMIDA as follows:
- Section 1. The Company has presented an application in a form acceptable to the Agency. Based upon the representations made by the Company to the Agency in the Company's application and other correspondence submitted by the Company to the Agency, the Agency hereby finds and determines that:
  - (a) By virtue of the Act, the Agency has been vested with all powers necessary and convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of the Act and to exercise all powers granted to it under the Act; and
  - (b) The Project constitutes a "project", as such term is defined in the Act; and
  - (c) It is desirable and in the public interest for the Agency to appoint the Company as its agent for purposes of acquiring the Equipment; and
  - (d) The action to be taken by the Agency will induce the Company to develop the Project, thereby increasing employment opportunities in Monroe County and otherwise furthering the purposes of the Agency as set forth in the Act; and
  - (e) The Project will not result in the removal of a civic, commercial, industrial, or manufacturing plant of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project from one area of the State of New York (the "State") to another area of the State or result in the abandonment of one or more plants or facilities of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project located within the State; and the Agency hereby finds that, based on the Company's application, to the extent occupants are relocating from one plant or facility to another, the Project is reasonably necessary to discourage the Project occupants from removing such other plant or facility to a location outside the State and/or is reasonably necessary to preserve the competitive position of the Project occupants in their respective industries.
- Section 2. The Agency hereby determines that the Project will promote job opportunities, health, general prosperity and the economic welfare of the inhabitants of the County of Monroe and the people of the State of New York and improve their standard of living, thereby serving the public purposes of the Act and, therefore, the same is approved.
- Section 3. The Agency hereby approves the cost/benefit report submitted by the Company listing the proposed cost/benefits of the Project.
- Section 4. Subject to the Company executing the Agent Agreement and the delivery to the Agency of a binder, certificate or other evidence of liability insurance policy for the Project satisfactory to the Agency, the Agency hereby authorizes the Company to proceed with the Project and hereby appoints the Company as the true and lawful agent of the Agency to acquire the Equipment, and such appointment includes the following activities as they relate the replacement of the Equipment, whether or not any materials or supplies described below are incorporated into or become an integral part of the Equipment. Said agent is authorized to make, execute, acknowledge and deliver any contracts, orders, receipts, writings and instructions, as the

stated agent for the Agency, and in general to do all things which may be requisite or proper for acquisition of the Equipment, all with the same powers and with the same validity as the Agency could do if acting on its own behalf. As agent of the Agency, the Company is authorized to delegate such agency, in whole or in part, to agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, contractors and subcontractors of such agents and subagents and to such other parties as the Company chooses. The Executive Director, Deputy Executive Director or any officer of the Agency are each authorized and directed to execute and deliver to said agent an appropriate letter on Agency letterhead describing the authority granted under this resolution.

Section 5. Based upon the representation and warranties made by the Company in its application for financial assistance, the Agency hereby authorizes and approves the Company as its agent, to make purchases of goods and services relating to the Project and that would otherwise be subject to New York State and local sales and use tax in an amount up to \$739,871, which result in New York State and local sales and use tax exemption benefits ("sales and use tax exemption benefits") not to exceed \$59,190. The Agency agrees to consider any requests by the Company for increase to the amount of sales and use tax exemption benefits authorized by the Agency upon being provided with appropriate documentation detailing the additional purchases of property or services.

Section 6. Pursuant to Section 875(3) of the New York General Municipal Law, the Agency may recover or recapture from the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, any sales and use tax exemption benefits taken or purported to be taken by the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, if it is determined that: (i) the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, is not entitled to the sales and use tax exemption benefits; (ii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are in excess of the amounts authorized to be taken by the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project; (iii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are for property or services not authorized by the Agency as part of the Project; or (iv) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are taken in cases where the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, fails to comply with a material term or condition to use property or services in the manner approved by the Agency in connection with the Project. As a condition precedent of receiving sales and use tax exemption benefits, the Company, its agents, consultants, subcontractors, or any other party authorized to make purchases for the benefit of the Project, shall (i) cooperate with the Agency in its efforts to recover or recapture any sales and use tax exemption benefits, and (ii) promptly pay over any such amounts to the Agency that the Agency demands.

Section 7. The Executive Director, Deputy Executive Director or any officer of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to negotiate the Agent Agreement, pursuant to which the Agency will appoint the Company as its agent for the purpose of acquiring the Equipment.

Section 8. The Executive Director, Deputy Executive Director or any officer of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency to do all acts and things required and to execute and deliver all such certificates, instruments and

documents, to pay all such fees, charges and expenses and to do all such further acts and things as may be necessary or, in the opinion of such Executive Director, Deputy Executive Director or any officer of the Agency acting, desirable and proper to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolutions and to cause compliance by the Agency with all of the terms, covenants and provisions of the documents executed for and on behalf of the Agency.

<u>Section 9.</u> This resolution shall take effect immediately.
