RMSC Career Ladders

- 5 Participants at start of the program
- 11 participants at the end of 1st quarter
 2022
- Goal in 2022 is to have 15 20 participants
- Career Ladder participant of 7 years was promoted to the full time position of Floor Supervisor

Economic Gardening

- Total of 8 Monroe County companies served in 2022.
- Over the past 10 years, the program has served 163 businesses in Monroe County.
- Committed to increasing participation among MWBE's.

BOCES SAME

- 50 Students have completed the SAME program at Monroe One BOCES since 2017.
- 120 students have completed the SAME program at Monroe 2 Orleans BOCES since 2012.

BOCES CDL

- Two cohorts completed to date.
- 11 participants 7 receiving MCIDC scholarship
- 91% pass rate/100% employment rate
- Newest cohort is underway.

ROC Your Hands

- Supported the first annual event at Rochester Community Sports Complex on October 4th.
- One-day event for 687 students in Monroe County for hands on introductions to careers in advanced manufacturing and building trades.
- 70% of the students were from the City of Rochester
- 65 different employers onsite
- Partnered with Rochester Technology & Manufacturing Association.

RETAIN Program

This innovative program offers recent graduates a \$2,000 lump sum payment after having lived, worked and networked in Monroe County for one year.

- Total number of businesses approved: 5
 Industries are IT and Life Sciences
 3 of the 5 are MWBEs
- Total number of participants: 9
- Total Dollar amount committed to date: \$18,000
- There are 10 more participants submitted but not yet approved - waiting on information from applicant
