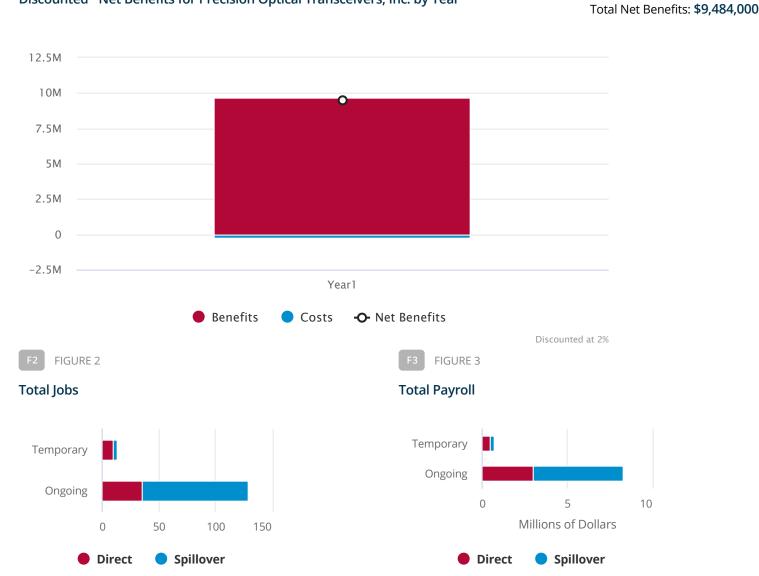

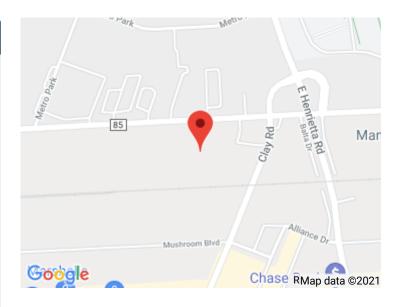

# Cost-Benefit Analysis
